

OLIVE CHURCH AND CEMETERY

Reformed and Lutheran people settled here in early times, and attended church at Brush Creek, almost twenty miles away. Father Weber preached for them occasionally in houses and barns. In 1815 Rev. Wm. Weinel took charge of this district, and a church was built in 1817 on land donated by a Mr. Beamer. It was called Beamer's Church. The first communion was held May 24th, 1817, when fourteen persons communed, and seventeen were confirmed.

A new church was built in 1871 in the same location. It was called Olive Reformed Church. It was dedicated June 30th, 1871, and destroyed by fire in 1916. It was rebuilt in 1916. It was disbanded about 1960.

These are the abstracts of all known records of Olive Reformed Church (1868 - 1956).



- 3. The pages are not numbered.
- 4. The pages are hand written > printed, some very poorly
- 5. The images are poor quality.
- 6. Finally, some of the pages could not be downloaded from FS >error messages.


